The dream of my grandfather is now into its 45th year, and when we glance through the timeline a lot of accolades and achievements are visible, but the picture is still work in progress. Last year has been a very tumultuous one for me as an individual both on a personal and professional level. The passing away of my father was something, which changed my world. The journey from an investment banker to the manager of the school was something I didn't fathom in the wildest of my dreams. The reins of the family run school came to me by default, and to be frank I was not sure if I was ready at that point. Almost a year into the job, I feel as if the transition for me has been a learning curve. The support of the teachers, students and the nonteaching staff has been immense and has helped carry me though the crests and troughs of the journey.

I believe that too much change is bad for any organization and hence have not tried to tinker too much with the ethos of the systems already in place. But what I have tried to do is to improve the basic infrastructure and quality that was on offer. One of the first things that came to my notice was the unpaved path leading to the toilets for the nursery kids and the roof on the pavement were one of my first implementations. Even though I have had the odd complaint on the items on sale in the "School Store", I felt at that point that a "School Store" was a necessity. My visit to one of the most prominent government schools in my locality strengthened my belief and I was aghast to see an outsourced vendor selling eatables and stationary to students of that particular school and running it as a pure business. So I opted to start a "School Store" for the convenience of the students and I have had a lot of parents giving good feedback about it.

The first day of school was nothing short of a nightmare for me and I wished I wasn't sober! A group of about 30 parents came to my office in the morning and literally held me hostage because the 3rd Standard classes were on the second floor and they were of the opinion that this was dangerous and I was also convinced by their argument. On the lighter side I had a parent come to me and complain that his ward had pain in his leg due to climbing 2 floors everyday, well I guess he forgot that the previous

two years the 3rd Standard was on the same 2nd floor and nobody in the office recollects any parent coming with such a complaint. In my justification I did the construction that was required and the 3rd Standard classes were shifted to the ground floor well before the deadline offered to me J. Another sight, which I sadly noticed, were the students walking in the muddy water filled paths during rainy season on their way to and from the main building. This was an issue that needed addressing on a priority and this was dealt with swiftly, by concreting the pathway to the main building.

The educational sector has changed a great deal from the early days of the school and a lot of it is for the better, but we still need to develop if we are to achieve the heights that we as a country dream of. I personally believe that every child is unique in his or her own way and he or she possesses some talent that has to be harnessed at various levels. For that sole reason I have started an elite group called "Synergia", consultants were hired to train a selected group of students from the 7th, 8th & 9th Standards. The training was



based on developing leadership skills, communication skills, effective public speaking, presentation skills, team building and other soft skills. To add to this I have added a new quiz program to the curriculum of events and this is called "Master Mind". This quiz was successfully conducted twice this year and the fact that the title was not defended by the winning team from the first edition show the talent pool available for such an event.

It has been proved time and again by various researches conducted that squad / house system is one of the best techniques to identify and develop team building and comradeship in a student and this in fact is one of the strongest foundations that we can impart

to a school child. So this year we have formed 4 new squads namely Alpha, Beta, Gamma & Delta and this system was followed in all competitions through the academic year. The seed of this idea was sown in my line of thinking by one of the LP teachers in the school and I credit her with all the success that has been associated with this.

Youth Festival is something that gives students a platform to show case their talent in various cultural events. So this year's Youth Festival was conducted and I was amazed by the plethora of talent on show. This is one area where we can bring in focused attention and I am sure we will be able to excel. As a student I was



There are certain changes that I would like to bring to the table in the coming years and this I feel is the path to take this organization forward and make it into one of the best schools in Calicut and this would paint a better picture of my grandfather's dream. For this infrastructure wise there will be a new School auditorium that will hopefully be completed and ready for the next academic year, and in addition to this there will be a new school canteen that should be ready by the next academic year.
